RO35 Health Promotion Campaigns

There are 4 topics to be taught followed by an NEA assessment and Health Promotion Fayre. This forms 30% of your final mark.

Topic 1: Current Public Health issues and impact on society

Looks at what makes a healthy society, current challenges, organisations and current campaigns and benefits.

Topic 2: Factors influencing health

Looks at life choices, factors that affect health & wellbeing, how you can lead a healthy life and what barriers there are.

Topic 3: Plan and create a health promotion campaign

Looks at aims, timescales, communication and delivery of a campaign.

Topic 4: Deliver and evaluate a health promotion campaign

Looks at how to introduce, deliver, evaluate and gain feedback on your campaign.

RO 33 Supporting individuals through life events

Topic 1: Life Stages

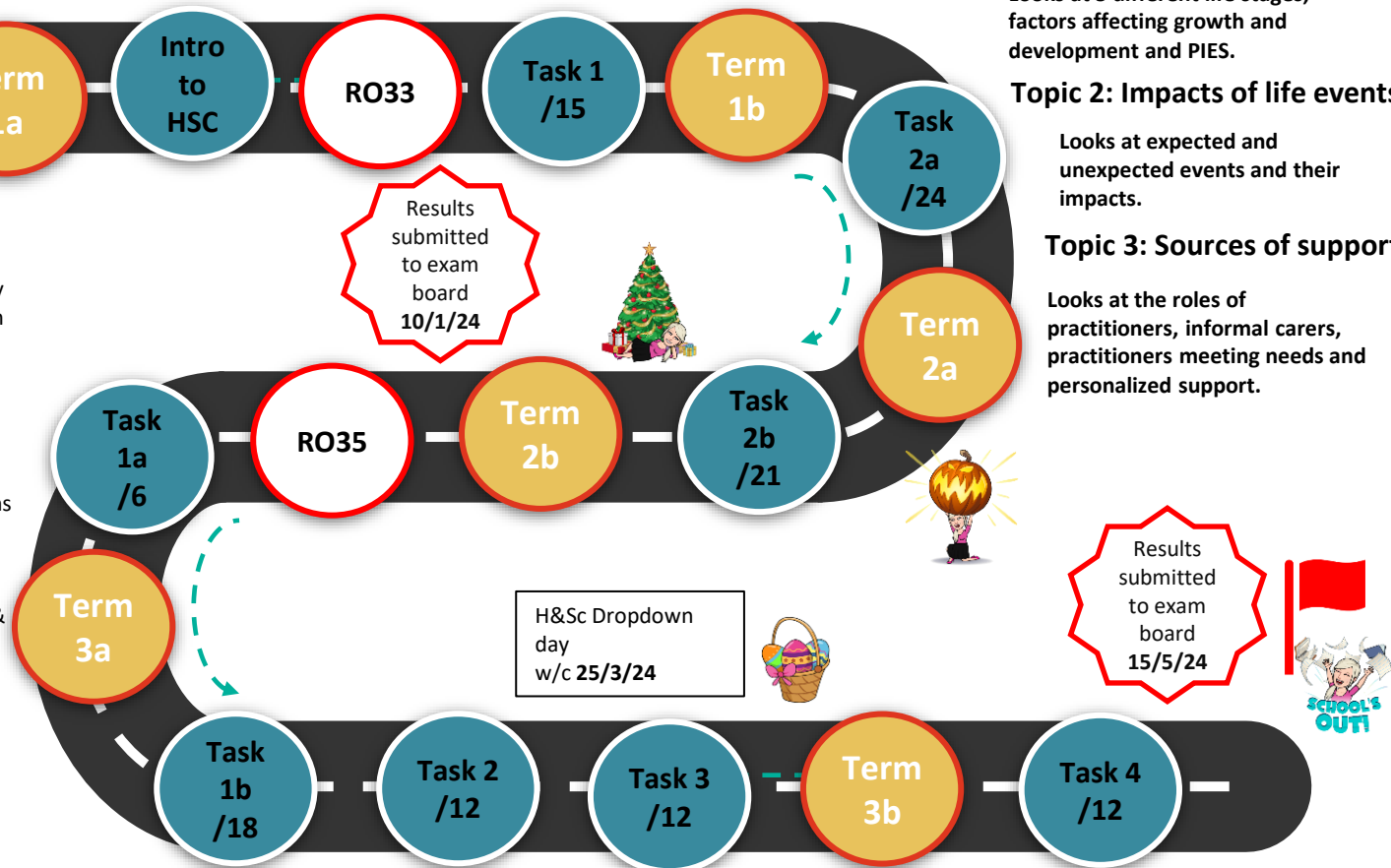
Looks at 5 different life stages, factors affecting growth and development and PIES.

Looks at the roles of practitioners, informal carers, practitioners meeting needs and personalized support.

RO 32 Principles of Care in Health & Social Care Settings

There are 4 topics to be taught followed by an external exam. The exam is 1 hour 15 mins and has 70 marks in total. This is 40% of your final grade.



Topic 1: Rights of individuals in HSC

Looks at types of care settings, the rights of individuals and the benefits of maintaining rights and meeting the needs of service users.

Topic 2: Person- centered values

Looks at how person centered values are applied by service providers, The 6 C's of care, examples of application in HSC settings and the benefits of these approaches to service users and providers.



Topic 3: Effective communication in health & social care settings

Looks at the importance of verbal & non-verbal communication, active listening and special methods of communication

Topic 4: Protecting service users and service providers in health and social care settings

Looks safeguarding, infection prevention and safety & security procedures.
